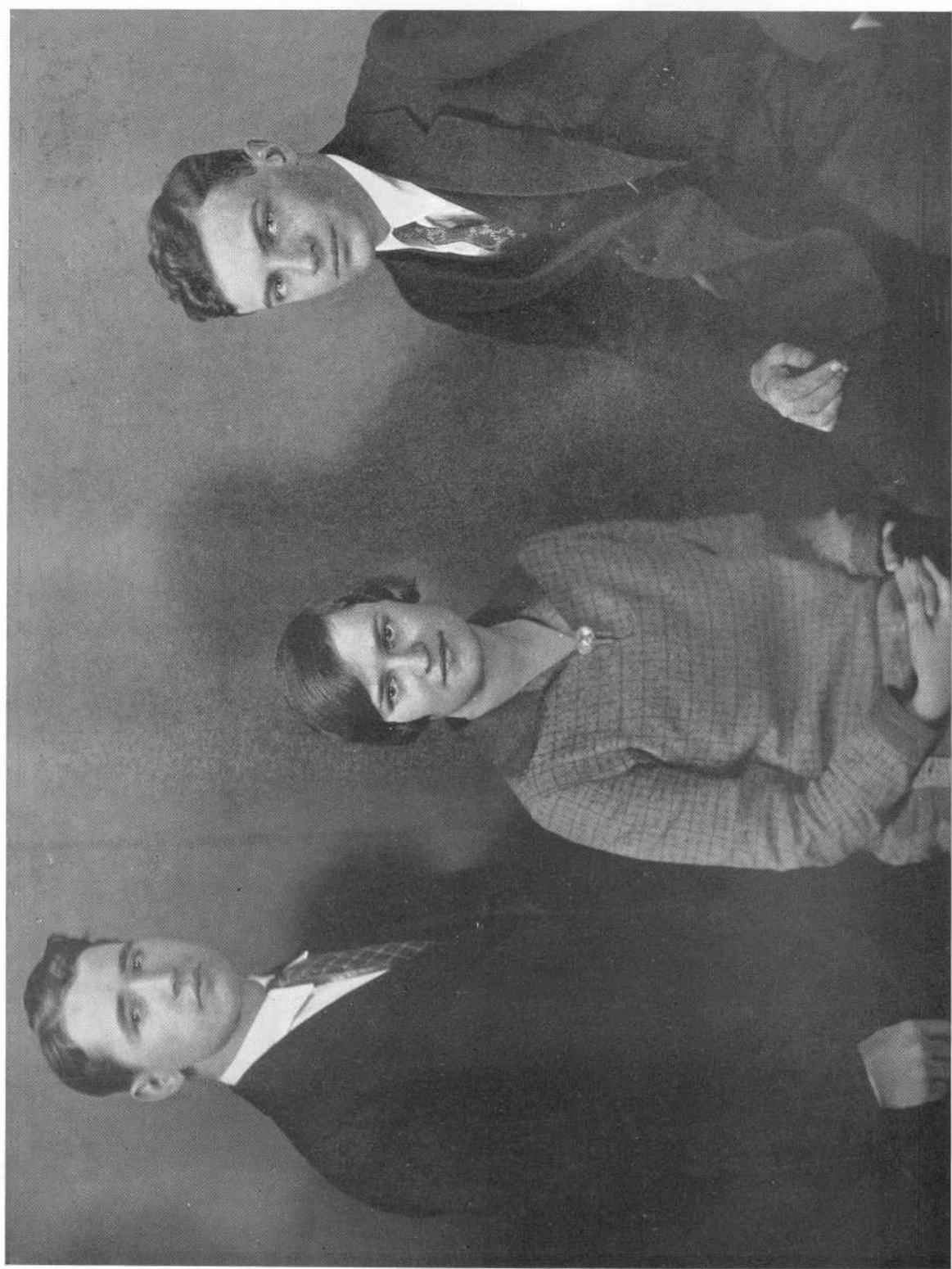

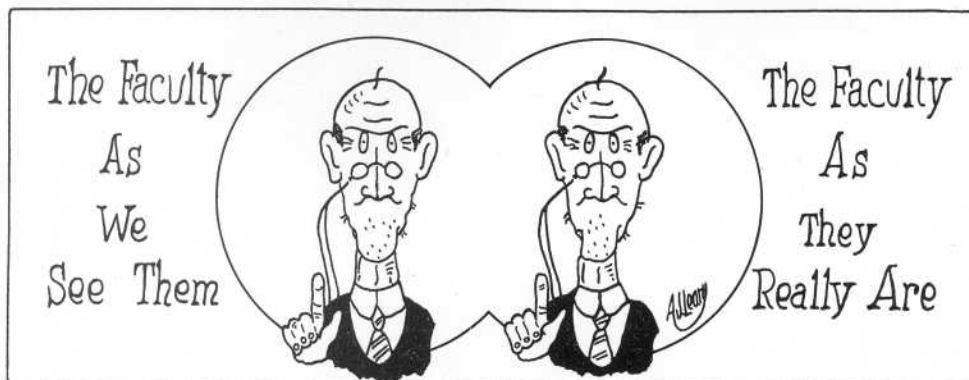

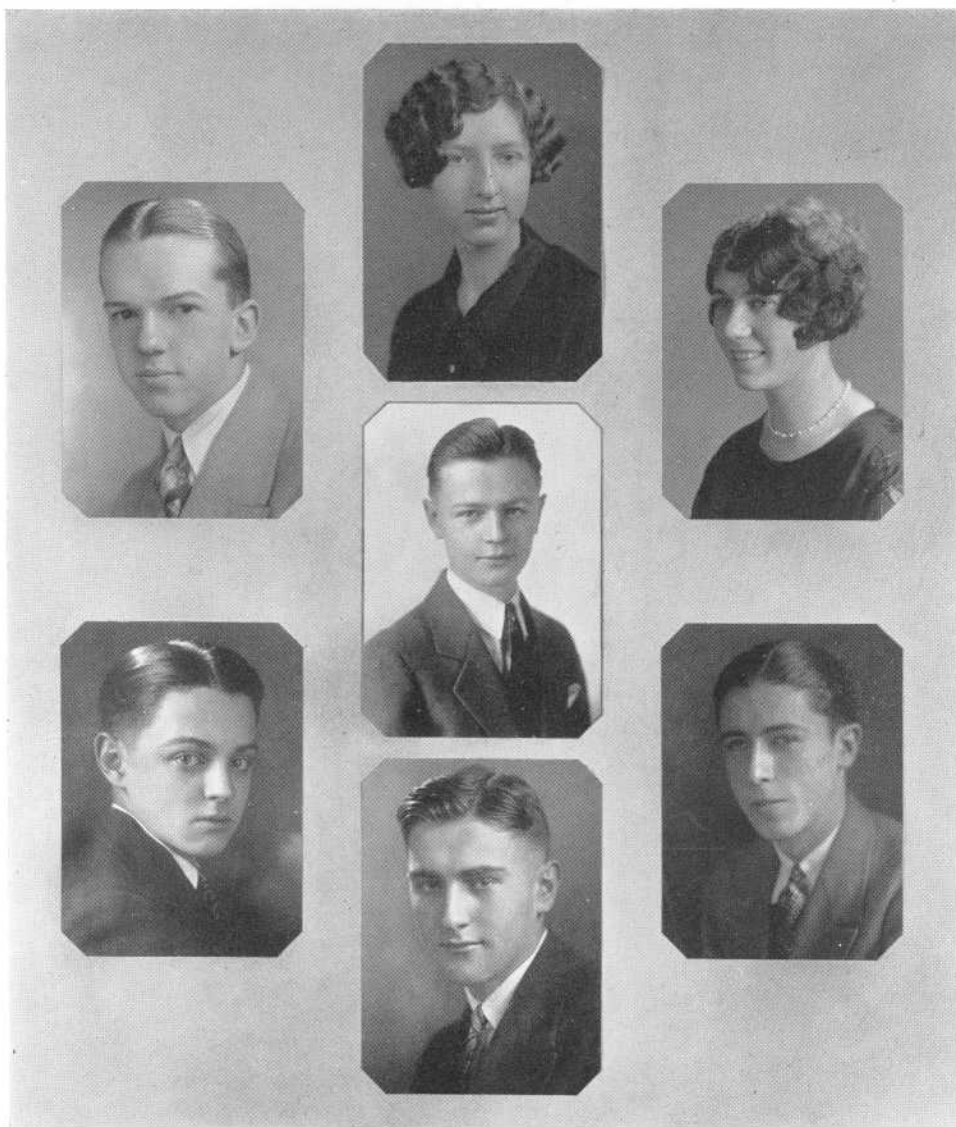

With the cooperation of the student body we hope that the staff will offer to the class of 1927 a Record Book equal to, if not better than, those of preceding years.

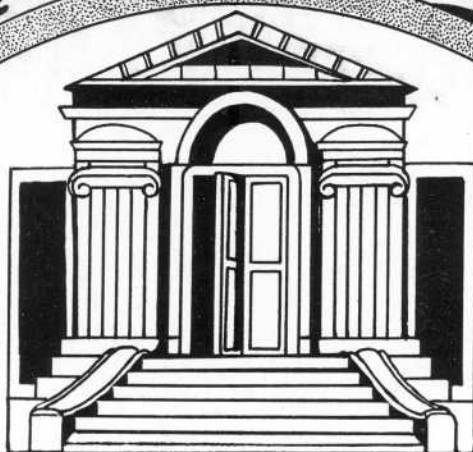

The main speeches will be twelve minutes and there will be one rebuttal by the affirmative. The audience will decide the winner.

The Forum is making arrangements for a home debate with New Bedford.

Mr. Giduz Introduces New Plan In Teaching Method

The DeWitt Clinton High School in New York has a plan to have the students who are efficient in their studies stay after school certain days and tutor those who are backward in their studies. These students who do remain after school and give up their spare time to do this tutoring will be given credit toward honors, also towards entering different clubs. Superintendent Belisle Advises Normal Girls

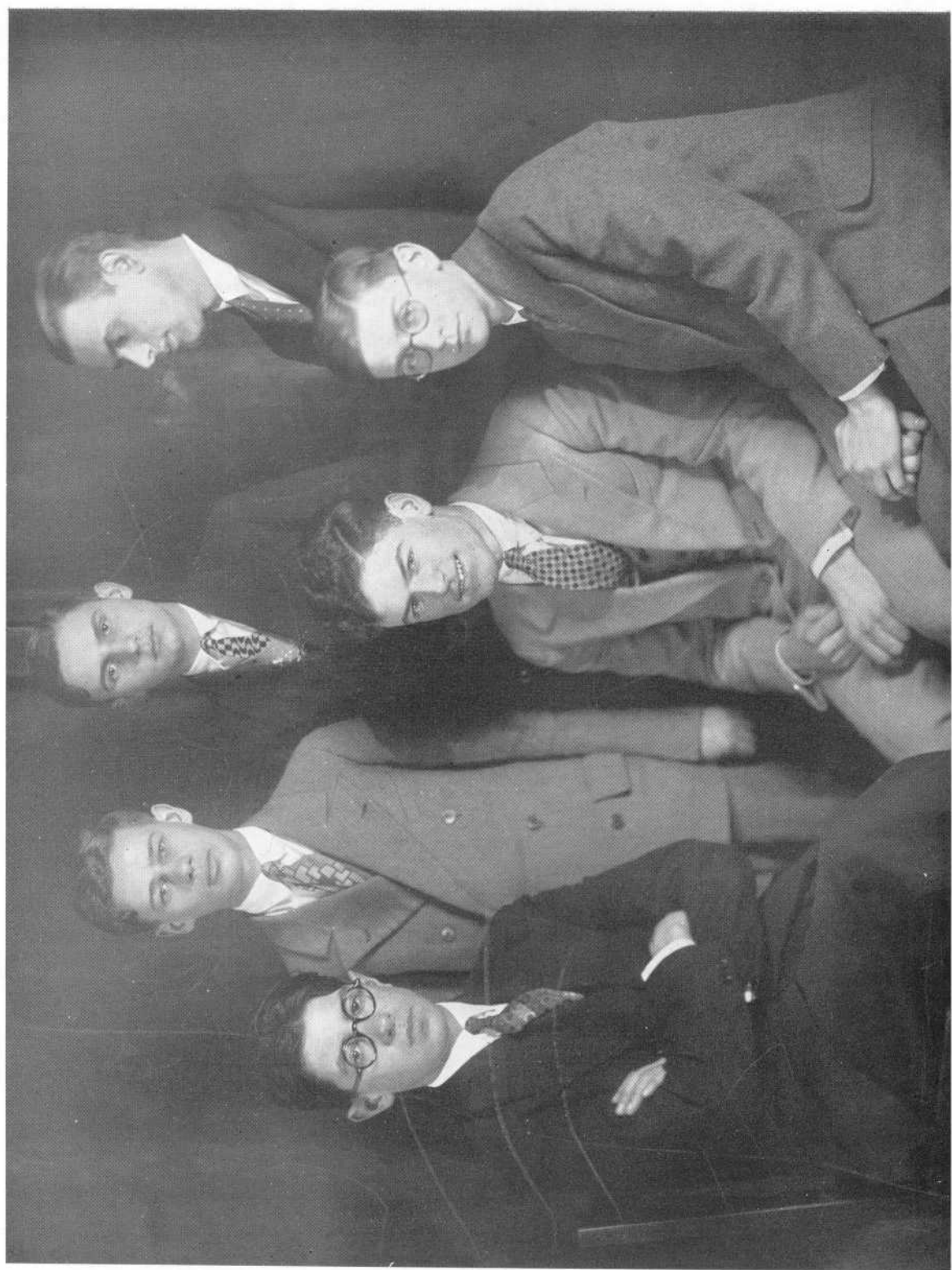
States That Pupils Must Have "B"
Average in Normal Schools
To Expect Positions

Mr. Hector L. Belisle, superintendent of schools in Fall River, spoke on scholarship for Massachusetts Normal Schools at the assembly for seniors, juniors, and sophomores taking the normal course, the third period Tuesday, Nov. 23.

Principal Charles V. Carroll introduced the superintendent. Mr. Belisle said that if the three hundred and fifty pupils in Durfee now taking the Normal Course should graduate from normal school, the last one would probably get work in twelve years. For a girl's name to be put on the school employment list, she must get an average of B the last year in normal school. From the ninety normal school graduates last year, sixty-five received an average of B, but only fifteen got work in the city, and about twenty-five outside of the city.

He also discussed the meaning of profession and especially that of teaching. He mentioned that the teachers who worked for wages alone didn't get very good results from their classes because they weren't really interested in what they were teaching. He concluded his talk by saying a job wasn't promised to any one taking a profession, but that if you are worth the job you get it.

Mr. Carroll then called the attention of the students to the scholarly requirements which he said were to be found on the Bulletin Board of Tech and Durfee.





The Durfee Debating Team

Early in the year Mr. Herbert Carroll, coach of debating, selected a squad of six men to uphold Durfee in the debating field. Those chosen were: Achilles Yannakopoulos and Eugene Belisle, seniors; John Kerrigan and Norman MacDonald, juniors; Harry Churnock and Edward Hanify, sophomores. Norman MacDonald was elected captain of the team.

Negotiations were completed with St. John's Prep for a debate to be held in January on the question of recognition of the Soviet Government of Russia. The Durfee team, composed of MacDonald, Hanify, Belisle, and Churnock, alternate, elected to uphold recognition. In order to help them out, Churnock, Kerrigan, and Yannakopoulos prepared a negative case and a public debate under the Oxford System was held in the Technical Auditorium one week before the interscholastic debate in which the affirmative won.

After almost two months of hard training the team journeyed to Danvers and won the debate. Transportation facilities were assured through the kindness of Judge Edward F. Hanify.

After a brief rest the same team with Yannakopoulos as alternate, started preparations to uphold modification of the immigration law against New Bedford in the Technical Auditorium on March 11. Other prospective matches were with Melrose April 1, and Worcester Classical April 29. If diligence wins its own reward the Durfee team should come through the season with a clean slate.

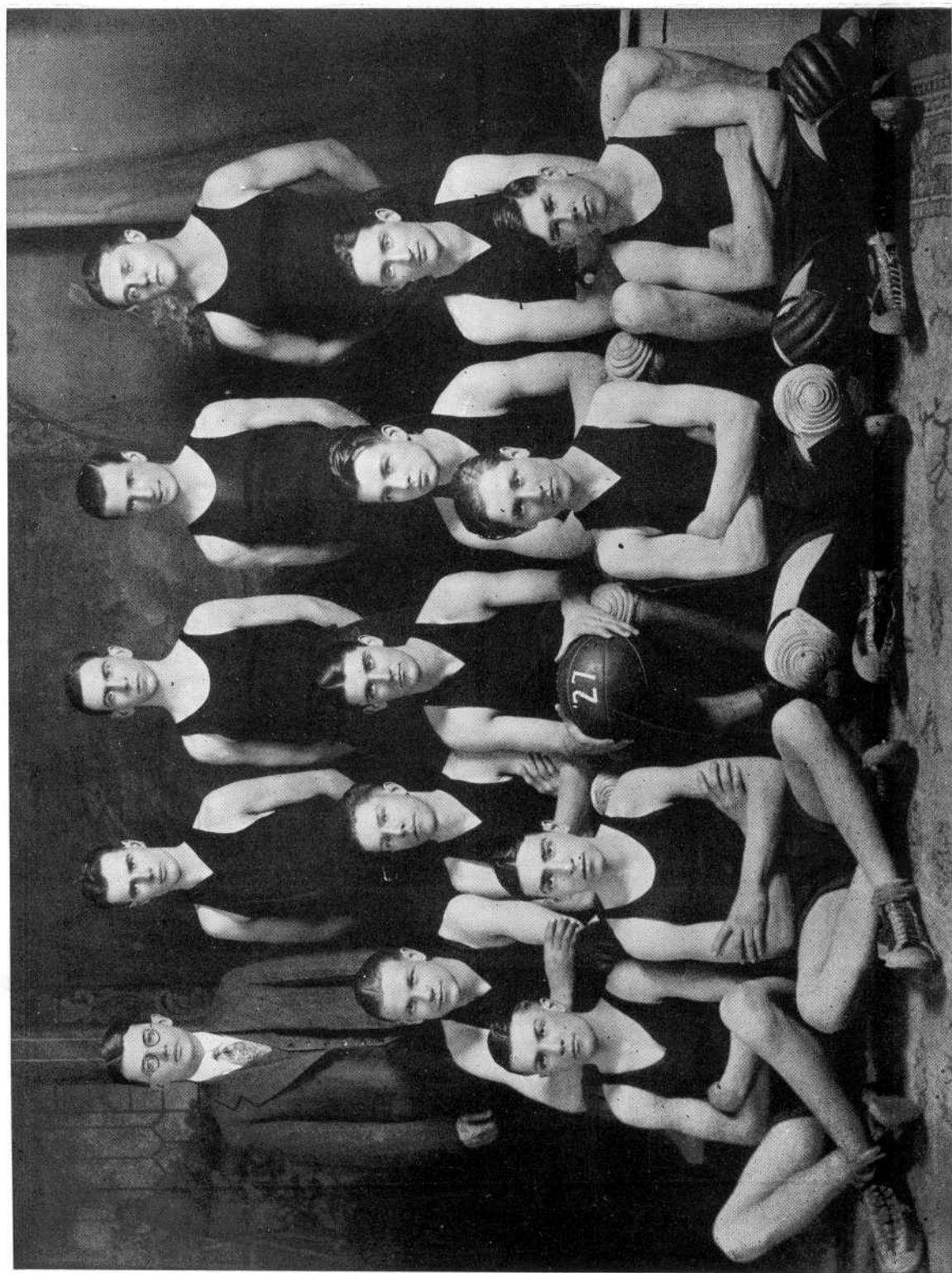
Hockey was started quite early in the year, but because of lack of candidates no teams were formed.

The 1927 basketball team was one that deserved considerable recognition despite the fact that they lost seven games out of fifteen.

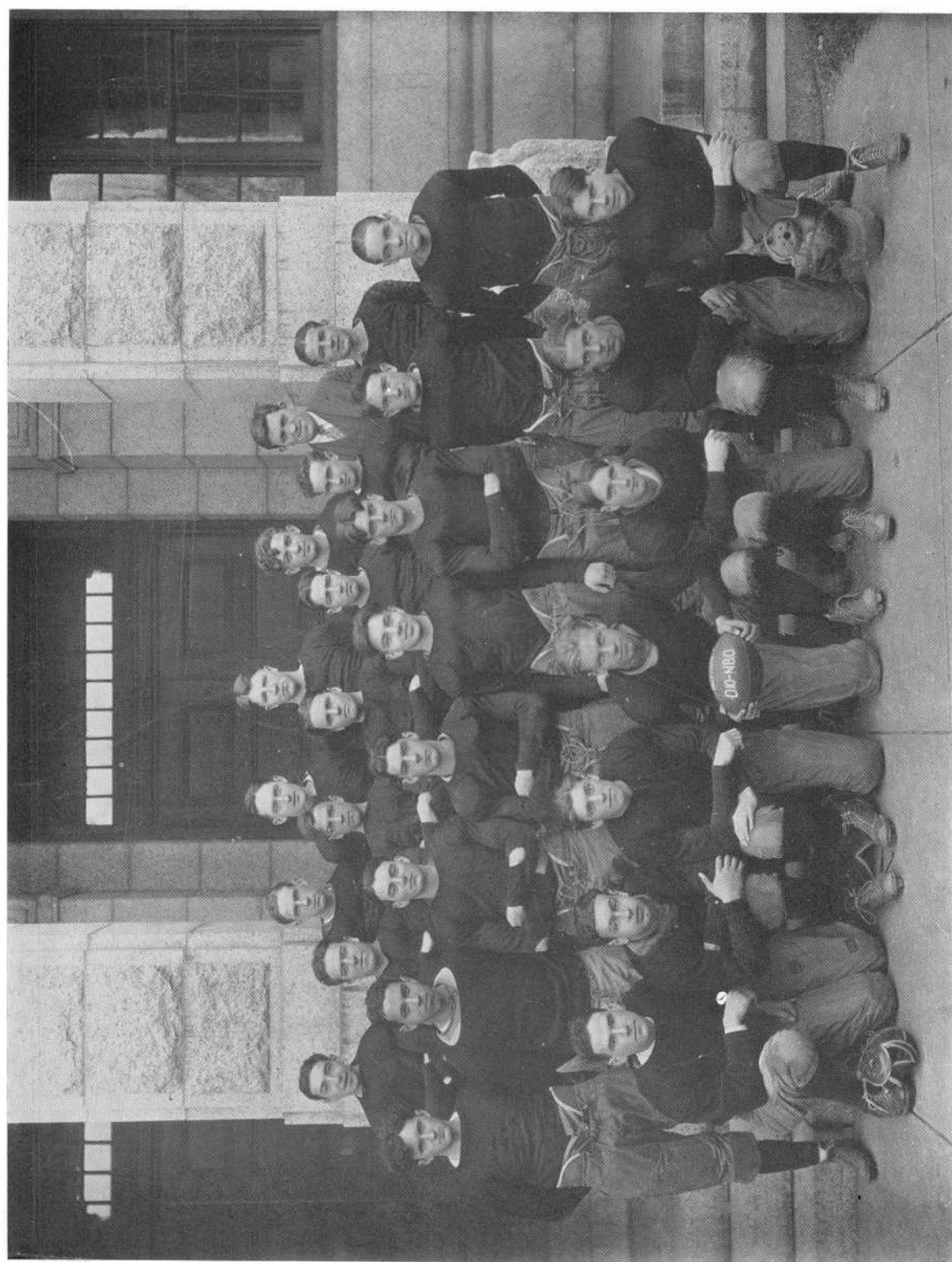

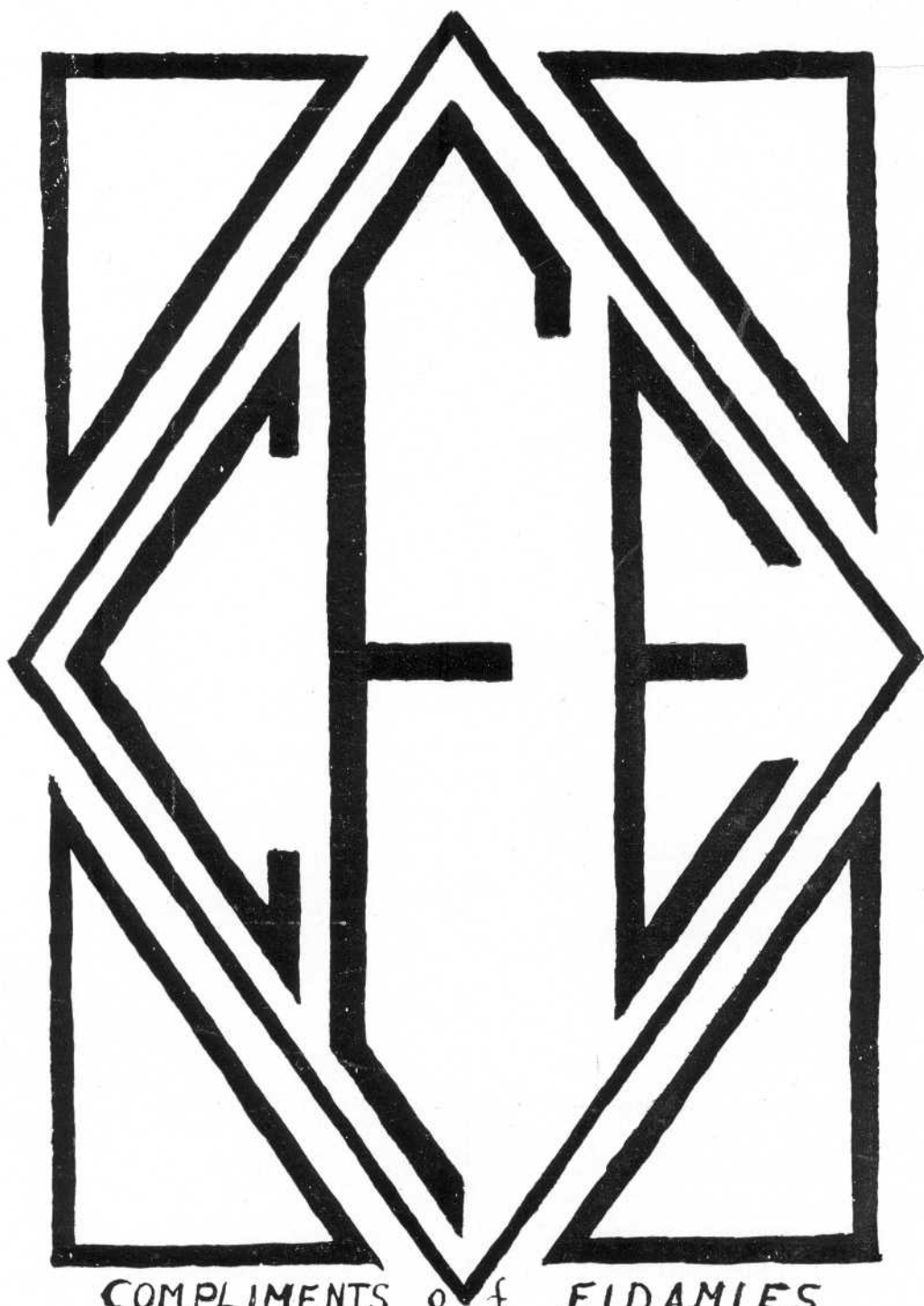
