After jumping off to a quick 23 point lead, with the running of Harrington, Murray and Fitzgerald, The Hilltoppers had to strengthen their wall as North Attleboro rolled within nine points losing 23-14.

Demonstrating some of last year's characteristics, the mighty Hilltoppers rolled over the Blue Devils of Fairhaven and romped to a 33-0 win.

Playing what was possibly their best football of the season, the


Durfee team trounced a strong traditional rival Coyle, 46-7.





Then the Hilltoppers was the first team to win a game in the first Massachusetts State as they edged out David Prouty High. 


