Item Group Editor

Do you need to move items between home locations or change item types for a large number of records? If you do, the Item Group Editor is the tool for you. This wizard allows you to create and save a list of titles that all need the same changes. For example, you can use this wizard for titles that you move from your general collection to the summer reading area. Using this wizard, you can create a list of titles that need the home location changed from Fiction to Summer read and those records will all be updated. Since the list is saved, you can easily reverse those changes when the summer reading titles need to be returned to the general collection.

Protecting Privacy

On July 27th, SAILS updated the Enterprise online catalog to use secure socket layer technology (SSL). The reason for the change is to protect patron privacy. Each time you fill out a form on the web, and the website is not a secure website, you're sending the data in plain text. If there is anyone online who is purposefully looking to capture data going over the net, your form submission is easy to get. Easy for people who know how to get that information. The average person isn't going to see what you sent unless they're looking over your shoulder, but if someone is using a software program to sniff out this type of information, they'll be able to get it.

SSL encrypts your data using technology that can't get decrypted without a key to unlock the code. The only one holding the key is the site on the other end. In our case, the link is between the patron's browser and our server, which is hosted by SirsiDynix. Patrons send minimal personal data through Enterprise, and most of it is anonymous, but as web services continue to increase opportunities for personalization, we'll be in a good position to offer new services as they become available.
