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Bookletters

Bookletters can be used in multiple ways to enhance your user's online experience and reach out to the community to build stronger awareness of everything your library offers. Libraries use BookLetters to promote their collections, send out library newsletters, as well as e-mail program reminders to their patrons.

BookLetters

How can your library take advantage of BookLetters?

Reader's Advisory:

- Link to full range of book award lists and pre-generated booklists (updated weekly or monthly) from your webpage.
- Library staff can create custom booklists, if they wish.
- All of the pre-generated booklists link back to the SAILS catalog.

Website Enhancement:

- Widgets can be used to promote titles for specific subjects, genres or formats, as well as new arrivals to the library's collection.
- Create a widget for your own custom booklists, if you wish.
- Integrating these widgets into your website provides updated, fresh content for your patrons.

Effective Communications:

- Patrons can select the booklists they're interested in receiving by e-mail.
- You can use it to send custom e-newsletters or e-mail blasts to your patrons.
- Post booklists, e-newsletters or other blasts to social networks.

For the libraries who are new to Bookletters, we will be here to help you get set up, provide training on the product, as well offer suggestions on integrating this new content into your existing webpages.

All of the booklists are automatically updated each month with fresh content and pushed out to the patron's who have subscribed. If you decide to take advantage of Bookletters to send e-newsletters to your patrons, there is a user friendly interface for creating an e-newsletter. Your custom newsletters can also be set up to have the your own library's branding.

We hope you will consider taking advantage of what BookLetters has to offer!

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New Enterprise Features - For the New Year!

The next Enterprise update (GA7) should be available shortly. Once we've done the upgrade, SAILS will record a webinar to be viewed by staff after the changes have been made, so you can become familiar with them. You're also encouraged to take a look at our test site, which currently has most of these elements already available. Follow this link to view our test site: http://sails.ent.sirsi.net/client/lib

New Links:

- The "Library Information" link at the top of the page will say "Forgot your PIN" and will be brighter and bolder looking.
- In place of the current "Forgot your PIN" link, we'll add a graphic & link to an Enterprise page featuring BookLetters' awards lists
- In the same area, we'll add a link / graphic to more prominently show off Omeka, our Digital History collection.

New Buttons:

- Search results page:
 - book lovers tool button that sends to detailed display page - to get people to look at the added content we have available, such as the book summaries, tags and read-alikes.
- Item details page:

 - staff view button – when clicked, a window will open with the full marc record.

 - add to GoodReads button - will take the ISBN in the record and pass along to the GoodReads site. If you have a GoodReads account, you can log in and add the book to your bookshelf.

Bookletters Integration:

- New Book alert sign-up we have added a link to a sign-up form for patrons to subscribe to the auto-generated Bookletters book alerts lists.
- Other reader's advisory features will be added over time.

Other Changes and Features:

Research Tools and Online Articles - some will be removed as they are no longer being updated. The PubPac felt they could not be responsible with keeping them current. This topic will be reviewed in 2015.

Responsive Catalog - This will recognize when users are using a mobile or small screen device and provide the user with a mobile version. Patrons will have the option to view the full screen by clicking on a link at the bottom of the page. To test this out on the test site, make your browser window smaller. As you narrow the width, you'll see the screen change to the mobile version.

BookMyne+

SAILS is testing BookMyne Plus. It is an enhanced version of the Bookmyne app that supports local branding and content. BookMyne Plus allows the user to select their particular library, which can be customized with the library's logo, etc. and links out to local content: suggested reading (powered by GoodReads (or suggested links), social media sites as well as a calendar (we still need to explore the options we have available with Event Keeper). Users can also search by location - BookMyne allows mobile users to find the nearest participating library on a GPS-enabled map. Future development will include incorporating the features of Sirsi Dynix's BlueCloud Commerce - which will allow users to pay fines online using the app (for public libraries).

If the test proves to be acceptable, SAILS will be able to use grant funds that the network is receiving to expand the product to all libraries. SAILS will continue to investigate other options as well. It is currently only available from iTunes, but should be in the Google Play Store in a future release.

Using Gmail to Compose an e-mail from an e-mail link

Browsers normally use your operating system's default mail program to send an e-mail message when you click on a "mailto" or e-mail link on a web page (e.g., jsmith@example.net). Generally, Windows will try to open Microsoft Outlook in order to compose a new message.

Would you like Chrome to use Gmail instead?

When you open Gmail in Chrome, a protocol handler icon Protocol Handler will appear in the omnibox (where you type in a URL or search) next to the star bookmarks icon. Click it to show the following options:

- If you'd like to allow Gmail to open all email links, select the **Use Gmail radio button.** When you click a hyperlinked email address on a page, Gmail's compose window will open.
- Select **No** to keep how your computer opens email links the same way as before.
- Choose **Ignore** to prevent the request from appearing again when you visit Gmail.
