BookMyne App

If you have an iphone/ipad or android phone, there is now a mobile app that let's you search the e-catalog and access your account. This latest version of SirsiDynix's BookMyne App now allows you to place holds and modify your personal lists (My Lists/My Bookshelf). It also can hook into your GoodReads account. The app is Bookmyne 3.0 and is available in your phones app store / market.

There are a couple of limitations, such as not being able to change your pickup location for existing holds, but it works and is just another way for you, and your patrons, to get to the catalog.

- 1. Where do you need to look to see a patron's paid bill?
 - 1. Look up the patron using the Display User wizard.
 - 2. Click on the Bills tab.
 - 3. Select Paid from the Bills drop-down box at the bottom of the screen.
- 2. What three answers to the question, "What do you want to do?" are given on Overdrive's MyHelp! Beta when you first click on the link?
 - listen to audiobooks, read ebooks, listen to music

3. Which are true of a keyword search?

- 1. Keyword searches words within the bibliographic record. True
- 2. Keyword can combine words to search the bibliographic record (Boolean).—True

3. Keyword can search a specific index (subject, title, author) and get an alphabetical results list back.—False. The reason this is false is because the browse search (called alphabetical list in e-catalog) returns an alphabetical list and it searches a specific index. If you don't select one, the results will be from the subject index.

For example, select the alphabetical list option in e-catalog. Search for: civil war You'll get back a list that starts with: Catalog Browse by Subject: "civil war"

Civil unions--Law and legislation--United States. Civil war. Civil War, 43-31 B.C.--Comic books, strips, etc. Rome--History Civil War, 43-31 B.C.--Drama. Rome--History

SAILS Circulation Users to Meeting January 10, 2012

SAILS will be hosting a meeting of representatives from all libraries at its semi-annual circulation users meeting. The meeting will be held from 10 a.m to noon on January 10th at the SAILS offices in Middleboro. A snow date has been set for January 24.

Agenda items will include an overview of the e-catalog, tips and tools for helping your patrons with the Overdrive collection, a preview of features in the 3.4.1 SirsiDynix release, mobile apps for patrons to access their accounts and place holds, and a review of searching techniques in Workflows. Sails To Redesign Public Website

SAILS has convened an advisory committee to assist the network staff in the redesign of a new public

website. Committee members are as follows: Amanda Viana – Somerset, Amy Tull – Halifax, Daisy Delano – Taunton, Olivia Melo – Lakeville, Sean Daley – Bridgewater, Laurie Lessner – SAILS, Ben Phinney – SAILS. The committee will be responsible for providing advice and guidance to the SAILS staff on the redesign of the SAILS public website. The network will be moving to Wordpress that we hope will eventually allow libraries to post content to the

site. Laurie Lessner will be responsible for the design and implementation. This work is not starting from scratch. A lot of work was done by the PubPac regarding content when we were attempting to launch the SoPac discovery system so we don't want to completely reinvent the wheel. Laurie is also using tools and guidelines posted on WebJunction. We hope that this preliminary work will allow us to get this site launched fairly quickly.

Sails Community Treasury Moving To New Platform

The SAILS Searchable Digital Collections will be migrating from a locally hosted server to <u>Omeka.net</u>.

Omeka.net is a web-publishing platform that allows anyone with an account to create or collaborate on a website to display collections and build digital exhibitions. This service will allow the SAILS digital collections to be fully compatible with the Massachusetts Digital Commonwealth web portal. It will also provide SAILS with the tools to provide hosting for libraries that are currently having historical collections digitized by the

Boston Public Library. The collection currently contains Cemeteries in the town of Carver, Plymouth County, MA Transcribed by John A. Shaw., the historical collections of the Hanson Public Library, the Middleboro Cranberry Collection, Plainville 1930 – its industries and history, the Rochester Community-Wide Historic and Architectural Survey 1997-1998, and the Helen Keller Collection at the Fiske Library. Once the collections have been moved to the Omeka site we will be adding the West Bridgewater historical postcard collection.

As the interest in digitizing historical collections is growing, particularly in light of the free scanning services being offered by the Boston Public Library, SAILS has formed an advisory committee to set policies and procedures for the Omeka site and the hosting services being provided by SAILS. Committee members are Debra Dejonker-Berry from Halifax, Deborah Wall, From Pembroke, Janice Allman from East Bridgewater, Kristin Slater and Debby Conrad from SAILS.

Are you thinking about lending iPads/tablets?

SAILS received information about a new product called MediaSurfer. It is a digital tablet management system. This new appliance will manage 16 iPad2s and can be expanded to manage 64 tablets by adding additional expansion towers. This first version will only manage Apple iPad2s and then other tablets will be added in future months. "It also makes managing, loaning, borrowing or renting tablets to your patrons… much easier!" The company will be showing the MediaSurfer for the first time at ALA mid-winter in Dallas. Also, they're offering an introductory price for the MediaSurfer until the end of February as limited quantities will be available. What's new on the wiki!

To date we have 43 users coming from 20 different libraries on the network wiki! Even more exciting, after last month's webinar, we had over 275 page views! Everyone who has been involved with this project, keep up the good work.

After looking through everyone's contributions, most people just need to take that final step of tagging their pages and the initial work of setting up the page is done. There is a lot of interesting data to be found in each profile page, but without a tag it is hard to find. For example, did you know the Seekonk Public Library circulates a nook? Since they tagged their page with it, I was able to discover that about them. If I was a library curious about circulating an ereader, I could follow that tag and go to their page to see if they've written anything about how they circulate their nook. Even if they haven't written anything, or I'm still curious about it, I know which library to contact about the practice of circulating an ereader. If other pages were tagged with nook, I'd have other places to go and people to talk to about this service.

To see some examples of how the wiki is currently being used, take a look at Middleboro's page, you can very quickly learn how they have utilized Foursquare, Print Management software, and their Self-Checkout Station. Easton's page does a great job of illustrating how their library has been taking advantage of the opportunities that social media like facebook has afforded them. Others are using it to show programming like book clubs. For instance, North Attleboro has listed their book club calendar, while Halifax has created a link to theirs.
