

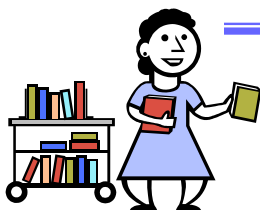

Spine Labels

The following is e-mail, sent by Elena Guadagno, Product Analyst, Montreal Lead, Sirsi Canada Inc.

Hello all,

I'm happy to announce that Sirsi is developing a Label Designer that will enable you to customize what information goes onto each label (for example, copy number, call number, author, title, date...). It will also allow you to customize your own rectangular labels (size & number of labels), be it spine or book or both. You will be able to Preview how your labels will Print prior to actually printing it. In addition, using certain rules that we have outlined, you will also be able to customize how a call number will be split on your label.

This functionality is planned for release with Unicorn 2003.

SAILS Library Network Hold Fulfillment Policy

All members must make circulating collections available for interlibrary loan to other members on the same basis as they are in their own member organization. (SAILS BY-LAWS approved 5/2000)

Popular circulating collections that may be restricted from filling network loans are:

- Rental
- Friends
- Restricted memorial

Requests for exemption from filling holds must be submitted in writing to the SAILS Board of Directors.

Libraries must have a minimum of 1 copy of a title of the same format available for system wide lending.

For every 3 copies of a restricted title, member libraries must purchase 1 additional copy for system wide availability

Oversize and multi-media kits are automatically exempt from filling holds due to the difficulty in packaging and shipping them.

ALA 2002 Annual Conference Report

I would have to say that my first introduction to an ALA conference would be hard to top! Since I had been down the web designer and Online Reference paths at previous conferences, I thought it would be nice to focus on Library Promotion. There are some excellent ideas out there. In fact, the first session I went to was titled: "A Showcase of Award-Winning Ideas from Small and Med.- Sized Libraries".

Three libraries were featured, but the last one stood out, due to the sheer volume of programs it hosted. The B.B.Comer Library, from Sylacauga, AL has done some wonderful programming, and grants provided most of the funding. Some of these programs include:

BIBS (Baby Information Books & Services)

Better Beginnings (same concept as BIBS, but for older children)

Mother Read/Father Read

"Keats-Fest" – in celebration of Ezra Jack Keats

In 1991, they created a Library Foundation, to subsidize the town's expenses, since many of its patrons are local residents. For information on their current programs, please visit <http://www.sylacauga.net/library/>.

Featured in the "Promoting and Marketing Your Library" session was the Sarasota County Library System. They focused on getting the library to become a presence in the community. After realizing people weren't coming into the library, they went to the people; parks, beaches, schools,

etc. At first, they went with paper and pencil, but now they bring a laptop with a wireless link to the catalog, and registered people right on site.

Each new town employee also received a library card application with his or her employment package. A town delivery system delivers holds right to the town hall employees.

I thought their best, and probably easiest idea, was to hook up with the local pizza delivery shop and have them deliver fliers, featuring library events, to their customers. They targeted teens when they realized the teenagers were ordering a lot of pizzas! The only cost was for the copies. It was also nice that a patron, who was more than willing to help the library, owned the pizza place. Again, it's getting the hook into the community.

The Salt Lake City Public Library System (<http://www.slcppl.lib.ut.us/>) has done a great job working with the local media to publicize their events. I will add the handout, chocked-full of press releases, to the PR Kits. Also mentioned is the Shy Librarian website (<http://www.shylibrarian.com/>) which is all about library promotion. You may download the pdf-formatted newsletter, free of charge, from their website. In fact, the BPL is featured in an article on p.1.

HERE Library

Would you like your library to be the default library searched, for patrons using the "Browse Subjects" and "Kids' Library" picture searches? If so, your wish can be granted. SAILS has installed a new program which can configure your library to have HERE be the default search.

What can this mean?

- People logging in from home will have the library that issued their library card, be the library searched for the picture searches.
- The patron isn't able to limit their search, to search "All Libraries", since a browse search doesn't allow limiting.
- If a patron is on the full-details screen, the can "change the display" to view all libraries' holdings.
