Mandatory Meeting Attendance

If a library fails to send representation to a mandatory educational meeting, the network will schedule on-site training for that library at a cost. The cost will be determined by the current mileage reimbursement rate for travel to and from the central site, plus an hourly fee that will include travel time as well as on-site instruction. *Approved June 18, 2003*



FY2004 ARIS Report

It is the time of the year again when all the SAILS public library directors are busy filling out the Board of Library Commissioners Annual Report Information Survey. As we have in the past, SAILS will be printing the basic collection, patron, and circulation information needed to complete the form

We will be providing everyone the option of having their reports printed on green bar, sent to their circulation finished reports folder, or compiled into a series of excel spreadsheets and distributed on a CD. For those people comfortable using Excel, this is an excellent way to sort out the data needed for the various sections of the report. In addition, we will be able to include some additional information such as lists of patron category and item category codes and their definitions as well as the network Interlibrary Library report. As an added benefit, we will include the ARIS forms and an accompanying Power Point presentation that will explain where to look for data in the different spreadsheets.

For libraries choosing the report on green bar or in the finished reports folder, we will be providing a similar Power Point presentation on the website. In addition, SAILS staff will be conducting a short overview for directors imme-

diately following the July 2nd Annual Meeting. There is no charge for the report on green bar and a \$2 fee for the ARIS on CD option. No matter what format a library chooses, SAILS will distribute all the reports by mid-July.

Fall River Public Library Update

The Fall River Public Library will discontinue operations in its temporary premises ("Fall River-Downtown") as of the end of the day on Friday, July 18, 2003. The South and East End branches will continue on their normal schedules. Operations in the renovated Main Library building should resume during the week beginning Monday, July 28, 2003, or, at the latest, during the week beginning Monday, August 4, 2003. Appropriate ceremonies will be observed in October.

To avoid having items in transit or checked out with the wrong owning library (we have to change the Fall River - Downtown items back to Fall River Main) we have turned off all holds on Fall River items. SAILS will turn them back on after the move is completed. Also, for the summer, the school libraries' items are no longer available to fill holds.

SurfHistory.com



Library in the palm of your Hand!

Soon patrons will soon be able to download your library's information to their handheld device!

SAILS will be enhancing your library's hours listing in iBistro, with instructions on how patrons can add your library's information in the listing to their mobile device. The listing will include your library's name, address, phone number, hours, contact email, driving directions, and a map from <u>MapQuest</u>. You will also be able to add your loan policies and

various other pertinent information to the listing, so patrons will always have your information at their fingertips!



Content from websites may be added to handheld devices such as the Palm products, Handspring Visors or Treos, and certain phones. All patrons need to do is click on the link in iBistro to add the information to their device. When they are at the library, they will need to have already set up an <u>Avantgo.com</u> account from home. If they are home, they will have the option of creating a new account and downloading the needed software.

Also, in the library, the email address in your directory will not be available.

A demo will be shown at the Annual Meeting on July 2nd.

SpamAssassin– Helping you fight SPAM

What is SpamAssassin?

SpamAssassin is a mail filter used to identify spam. Using a rules base system, it uses a wide range of heuristic tests on mail headers and body text to identify "spam", also known as unsolicited commercial email. For those of you that use WorldClient to retrieve your SAILS email you may have noticed various messages being delivered over the past couple of weeks that have been identified as SPAM in the subject of the email.

These messages will be automatically filtered into a new Spam folder, under your folders list in WorldClient. You can check this folder periodically to make sure that all of the filtered email is indeed unsolicited and then permanently delete them. Please contact <u>Steve</u> at SAILS if you have any questions or concerns about this new filtering tool.
