

The system will be totally unavailable for use - this includes both Workflows and iBistro access.

SAILS to Replace Sirsi Computers in July

The SAILS Library Network received \$88,500 in grant funds from the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners to replace the Sirsi production and test servers, both of which are now more than 5 years old. The two servers will be replaced the week of July 25. During the time that data is being transferred from the old computer to the new computers the system will be totally unavailable for use – this includes both Workflows and iBistro access. The current estimate is that the downtime will last 3 full working days (Monday – Wednesday) and with libraries beginning to connect one at a time on Thursday.

Sirsi recommends the use of the off-line circulation client during this extended period of downtime. SAILS will be testing the new off-line circ client in early June and will begin conducting training sessions on its use in late June and early July. Following is the current timeline for implementation.

SAILS To Begin Regional Roundtables

During the next fiscal year (July 1, 2005-June 30, 2006) SAILS will be conducting regional roundtables for Cataloging and Circulation staff members. The purpose of these meetings will be to allow staff members who might not normally attend a meeting at the SAILS office to meet with SAILS staff and staff members from other libraries with responsibilities similar to theirs.

The roundtables are also intended to provide a more casual venue for information sharing than the more formal advisory committee meetings. At the present time the network is planning on conducting 2 cataloging and 4 circulation roundtables. At the conclusion of the year we will evaluate the effectiveness of these roundtables and determine whether the number should be expanded.

MyAccount Label Change

Based on a previous suggestion, the label for holds not yet available for pick-up has been changed to read "Pending", on the MyAccount page. It used to say "Unavailable".

You may want to alert patrons to this on your website. We have updated the SAILS login screen with the change.

Suggestion Box

Comment: I use the advanced search more often than the regular search. Would it be possible to make the advanced search accessible from every screen in iBistro instead of just the "Home" screen? As it is now, if I'm on any screen other than the "Home" screen, I first have to go back to the "Home" screen and then click on "Advanced Search."

SAILS Response: Within the limits of the software, we could change the default search on the home page to use the advanced search. Since iBistro is primarily for patron use, this wouldn't be advisable

The other option is to perform a simple search, then use the "limit search" option at the bottom of the hit list.

We could also explore having a special login for reference staff, which would have the advanced search be the primary search. We will bring this issue to the PubPac Committee.

Gnomes in the Catalog

For those libraries participating in the Gnomes across Massachusetts program in conjunction with this year's sum-

mer reading program, we have a bib. record for the traveling gnome. All libraries in this gnome program can attach their gnome holdings to a1179406. This bib. record is currently in the request record format, but it will be updated soon to a fully cataloged record, including subject headings. The bib. record will include a general note explaining that the gnome is part of the summer reading program.

You can use whatever Item Type your library currently uses to correspond to the amount of time you wish the gnome to circulate (for example, 1 week, 2 weeks, etc.). Kristin has created a Gnome ItemCat1 for all libraries to

use. The home location for your library's gnome is entirely up to each library.

Cool Search Tool for iBistro-Revised

- 1. Follow this link: http://sailsinc.org/librarylookup.htm
- 2. Right Click on the link called "Library Lookup"
- 3. Left Click on "Add to Favorites" and say to allow the unsafe favorite.
- 4. In your browser, drag to link from your favorites to your links toolbar
- 5. Go to www.amazon.com and do a search for some semi-popular title.
- 6. While on the title information page, click the "Library Lookup" button

SAILS Directors Hold Day-Long Strategic Planning Retreat

On May 18 the directors of 28 SAILS members attended a day long planning retreat at On Cranberry Pond Bed and Breakfast. The retreat began with a presentation from Stephen Abram, Sirsi Vice President for Innovation, entitled "The Perfect Storm," which focused on a number of technological developments that could affect how libraries provide service. In the afternoon the directors participated in breakout sessions intended to identify issues that will affect SAILS over the next 5 years. The retreat concluded after the participants defined 5 goals that will be addressed in our next 5 year plan:

- 1. Expand funding for the network
- 2. Provide unimpeded access to the Integrated Library System (i.e. Sirsi)
- 3. Expand the Customer Service program to member libraries
- 4. Evaluate and implement proven and appropriate new technologies
- 5. Develop and maintain a marketing program that recognizes the need for patrons to identify with their local library.

The next step in the planning process will be the forming of 5

working committees charged to expand these goals into a set of objectives and tasks. The chair of the Long Range Planning committee is calling for volunteers willing to serve on of these committees. If you think you might be interested, please send email to lrp@sailsinc.org indicating on which committee you would like to serve. In the past, participation in a Goals Committee involved reading background documentation and attending 2 committee meetings.

- The number of patron placed holds has increased 73% over the past 3 years



As you can see from the chart, showing checkouts by subject, the most popular subject is Mystery. This may be due to the fact that most of our 50 Unlimited Checkout titles are in the mystery genre.

At the last OverDrive Implementation Committee meeting, several new titles purchased. We were finding that many titles were checked out and the hold list was growing. Unless the format was an Adobe eBook, patrons need to request an early return, and we needed to get more titles available so patrons wouldn't turn away from the service, thinking we never have any books available. iPod Transfer—eAudio Books

The following instructions are for you to share with your patrons who ask how they can get the OverDrive audio books to play on an iPod. We can not post these instructions in the OverDrive help files, because publishers would not be happy with us publicizing ways to get around the digital rights management feature.

- 1. Download the audio book chapter(s) you wish to transfer
- 2. Burn to CD
- 3. Open the CD in iTunes
- 4. Right Click on the selection (track)
- 5. Left click on "Convert Selection to AAC"

It takes a few minutes, but it will convert to the Advanced Audio Coding (AAC) format. It looks like it should then be ready to transfer to an iPod.
