# Commonwealth Catalog Roll Out has Begun!

## Staff Initiated Borrowing Requests

Library staff should be placing requests on behalf of their patrons in ComCat now. (Please remember to login is as the patron when placing a request. Choose your library from the list and enter their barcode and PIN.) If you are unable to locate an item in ComCat, please consider using Point-to-Point to fulfill the request instead of placing any new requests in the VC; this will simplify the clean-up effort.

Please do not publicize this service to patrons yet. The system will be made live for them to place their own requests around the middle of the month. (In the meantime, patrons will continue to have access to the Virtual Catalog). This should be a time for you to become familiar with the system before you will need to assist the patrons! We will have a special login page for patrons to use that will "go live" on June 15th.

## Wednesday, June 10th - SAILS opened to fill Lending Requests

Other ComCat libraries will begin requesting items from SAILS Member Libraries. Requested items will show on your daily RHA reports. However, instead of being routed to URSA, they will be made available as a hold at your library for a "library as patron" (ie: Dennis Memorial Library). Once the hold has been made available in Workflows, library staff should login to the ComCat system as ILL Staff to process/ship the request to the Borrowing Library. The title will appear in the "Pending" list under "Manage Lender Requests" in the ComCat dashboard. (If you have not attended a training session and do not yet know how to process these requests, please e-mail <u>support@sailsinc.org</u> and we take care of the request so it moves on to another lender.)

## Monday, June 15th - Commonwealth Catalog made available to patrons

Links to Virtual Catalog will be removed from Enterprise and replaced by a link to the ComCat login page. Virtual Catalog will be closed to new requests by SAILS patrons by the end of this week. The VC system will be available for staff to process/close out existing requests for a time. A final draw down date for the Virtual Catalog is still to be determined.

# Southworth Library Offers New Fax Service - FAX24

The Southworth Library is now offering a new fax service to its patrons. There is no cost to the library, requires no staff intervention, and accepts credit card payments. The fax machine does not require a dedicated telephone line. The service is called FAX24 (http://fax24.us/).




Fax24 sends you the fax machine and signage. Patrons need to use a credit or debit card. The library can purchase cards from Fax24 for faxing 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 6, or 18 pages, and the library can sell them to patrons who only have cash. It can also be used to scan documents to email. The staff likes it because it doesn't require their attention and patrons like it because it is easy to use and accepts credit card payments.

## **Bookletters - scheduled send feature**

If your library would like any custom newsletters or booklists to go out automatically each month, you now have the option to select a date for it to be delivered. (The pre-generated newsletters have already been scheduled at the network level.)

For any ePage that has an audience attached, click on the blue Send button. This will open a window that will give you two options for the newsletter going forward. If you would like the newsletter to continue to be delivered monthly, select the Send Monthly option, choose a date, and click on Schedule Monthly Send to complete the action.

# Library Telescope Program - Aldrich Astronomical Society

The Aldrich Astronomical Society, Inc. is working in collaboration with the Cornerstones of Science based in Brunswick, Maine, to support the Library Telescope Program. This program enables interested libraries throughout Massachusetts to acquire a loaner telescope for their library patrons. The Plumb Memorial Library in Rochester will be participating in this program, through the generosity of a former resident.

The goal of the Library Telescope Program is to help foster scientific literacy, stimulate an interest in astronomy, and provide people who have never looked through a telescope, the chance to experience the excitement that comes from discovery. Placing the telescopes in local public libraries allows a greater general access to the telescope since they are intended to be checked out of the library just as a book.



The telescope used in the Library Telescope Program is the Orion StarBlast 4.5-inch Astro Reflector Telescope, modified to provide durability for the telescope loaner program, is equipped with an 8- 24mm zoom eyepiece, and comes with supportive material.

The Aldrich Astronomical Society, Inc. is excited and happy to extend this outstanding educational outreach program to libraries throughout their Massachusetts service area through their Adopt a Library Program.

Funding for the scopes can come from a variety of sources: library friends groups, community grants and sponsorship by library patrons or local corporations interested in giving something back to their communities.
