Report from the Executive Director

In last month's newsletter I reported that SAILS was planning a migration from leased Verizon lines to higher speed Internet based lines for libraries currently using Verizon as the primary method of getting to SAILS. We now have a timeline for this cutover. Our Internet Service provided by the University of Massachusetts will cease in mid-January 2010. SAILS is replacing that service with a high-capacity FIOS line running to the central site. This new line should be active by early December at the latest. Existing VPN sites will then have their software modified to point to the new Internet lines. We have ordered Comcast circuits for libraries currently on Verizon lines. The new Comcast circuits will be installed the last week of November. Technicians from FTG Technologies will be going on site to do the cutover from Verizon to Comcast. This should all be done by mid-January. Our entire Verizon wide area network should be discontinued by February 2010. Not only will this transition save the network and its members a substantial amount of money but the bandwidth provided by Comcast is considerably higher than what we could get from Verizon.

Work continues on our Open Source user interface. A new logo has been selected and basic format for the SAILS website and OPAC is taking shape. A programmer is developing "hooks" from our SirsiDynix system to retrieve and display information for patrons. We hope to have a prototype to demonstrate by early January.

Work continues on the state level to develop a statewide delivery system that eliminates the need for transit slips and provides some auto sort functionality. An RFP for vendors interested in providing this service should be sent out in early 2010. At the September 2009 circulation meeting the need to begin duplicating existing barcodes and putting them on the outside cover was discussed. The RFP is going to require that the vendor does the barcode duplication for items that do not have a barcode on the outside so this will save staff from having to handle a major project. Laurie Lessner is the SAILS representative on the RFP committee and Network President Manny Leite (East Bridgewater) is the alternate.

SAILS staff has been working with SEMLS to see if a method can be developed to allow transit slips to be printed from receipt printers at the time items are put in transit in Workflows. Following a format currently in use in the Old Colony Library network we were able to enlarge the type font and format the slip to be

more usable by the delivery company. Samples have been forwarded to SEMLS and will be evaluated by the delivery company. We certainly hope that this capability will be available in the very near future.

restrooms!




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SAILS New Logo Selection

This is very important because the next version of Workflows will begin separating the 3 parts of the name and the City and State fields. For this to work, we need to update the database to separate the fields for the patrons already in the system. If the names and addresses are wrong, we could run into serious problems.

The correct format for a name is like this:

Smith, John James Jr.
Smith,[space]John[space]James[space]Jr

Shopper Card Sets—Order Now

Orders are now being accepted for shopper card sets. We must have minimum combined order of 5,000 cards to place the order. The highest price per card will be 25 cents. If we can get an order of at least 20,000 the cost will be 15 cents per card.

If you haven't used these cards before they consist of a standard sized card and a key chain sized card. The cards are personalized with the library name and address on the back. The patron barcode is imprinted on the card itself. These are very popular with patrons.

If you want to place an order please use the SAILS order <u>form on our website</u>. We will accept orders through November 13. As stated above there is a minimum quantity that we must reach before we can place the order. If we don't reach that quantity we will not be able to place the order.

Check your supplies NOW. The next order will not be until very late spring 2010. We can't place an order for a single library.
