Tracking Nonresident Circulation by Zip Code

Starting December 1 every public library will have a new report in its finished reports folder. This report will provide a breakdown of circulation transactions for the previous month by zip code rather than usercat2. Initial testing has proven this will be a more accurate method for libraries to track nonresident usage. The director of the library will receive a copy of this report via email. The long-term plan is to replace the old report of nonresident borrowing for the ARIS statistics with this report. Once this is in place the network will begin working taking steps to convert Usercat2 to a more generic code for tracking by age and gender of the patron. This code would be common among all libraries and should provide more useful statistics if patrons travel between libraries.

Place Holds from Goodreads!

When you find books in GoodReads and want to immediately check the SAILS Network to place the title on hold, set yourself up to have a single click search to the network by following these steps.

- 1. Log into GoodReads.
- 2. Go to your profile by clicking on your icon in the upper right of the page.
- 3. Click on the "edit profile" link next to your name. You'll be on a page called "Account Settings".
- 4. Click on the "book links" tab.
- 5. On the right, you'll see a list of popular links. Change the sort to "alphabetical" and go to about page 7. Here you'll find a link to the SAILS Library Network.
- 6. Click the "add" link and then you'll see it appear in your "Customize My Links" list on the left of the page.
- 7. Here you can move the SAILS link up so it will appear when you're on a title and want to see if it's available at the network, as seen here:



Google in the Gale Resources

Last month I attended a webinar from Library Journal titled, "Geeking over Google and eBooks". It showed how Google Drive is now integrated into the Gale databases. Massachusetts has Gale as the <u>statewide database</u> <u>vendor</u> and through your SAILS Gmail account, you have 30Gb of storage in Google Drive. There are several

benefits that you can share with your patrons and students. Here are some keypoints.

You can connect your personal or SAILS Google account with Gale and allow the Gale system to write to your Google Drive account. This allows you to save/download single articles, multiple articles, and citations directly to your drive. You can also make notes and highlights in the text and save these to your Drive as well.




Gale knows to organize what you're saving into folders titled after the resource you're accessing. For example, I'm looking in the Business and Economics Theory Collection and have saved notes and hightlights from an article and four citations of the four articles I also saved. These are all put into the Google Docs format, so now I can modify and add quotes and citations into my report. Of course from here I can share my report with others as well. The integration of Google Drive with Gale makes it easier than ever to research, collaborate and access your resources and work from anywhere that has an Internet connection. All you need to do is log into your Google account and it's all there. If you're on a computer other than your own, remember to log out when you're done.

BlueCloud Visibility

Some of you may have read that SAILS signed up as an early user of the SirsiDynix product called BlueCloud Visibility. If you haven't, don't worry. Most people haven't heard about it, hence this article! The point of the service is to turn our catalog / bibliographic records into a format that Google and other search engines are able to read and present to searchers. If a patron is searching for a lady gaga album, they'll find a link to get it in a library! Since this is a new service, the catalog needs to be indexed and people need to click on these links for Google to put us higher in the rankings and at the moment, we need to be pretty specific with our search. Here is an example of a search I just did. You'll notice the result for our copy is #4. That's not bad!



When someone clicks on the link, they're taken to an intermediate web page with the bibliographic record, a link to the SAILS site to get a library card, and a drop-down of libraries who own a copy of this title.

If someone clicks on the library link, it takes them to the library's enterprise site. If people click on the subject headings on the right, they're taken to a page where they're given a <u>slider of book jackets</u> in alphabetical order for that subject. They can explore further down the chain of subject headings or click on a link to get to enterprise to put the title on hold.

It's rather exciting to know our items are starting to find their way into Google results. It makes me hope that people will realize we're still relevant, have content they actually want, and then once they're in the library, can discover the other services you have to offer them.
